Top 5 Items to Keep OUT of Your Recycling Cart

Here are the 5 top items that should never be placed in your recycling cart:

- 1. No Garden Hoses. Despite being made from rubber, vinyl or a combination of both, this item still belongs in the garbage container.
- 2. No Diapers. Diapers should be placed in your garbage container.
- 3. No Hazardous Waste. This means no paint, motor oil, batteries, syringes, needles, etc. Hazardous Waste puts our trucks and facility at risk and should not be placed in your garbage cart either. Visit www.sbcfire.org/hhw to locate your nearest hazardous waste collection center.
- 4. No Pet Food Bags. The wax coating prevents the bags from breaking down in the recycling process, so pet food bags go into the garbage container.
- 5. No Electronic Waste. These items are best recycled through bulky item drop-off or a collection event.



Temporary Containers for Special Clean-Ups Available

Burrtec offers large and small containers for residential clean-ups and special projects. Containers are available for seven-day rentals and include delivery and removal. All unwanted materials can be placed directly into the container with the exception of hazardous waste, tires or large amounts of dirt, rock, concrete or asphalt. Household Hazardous Waste

Many households generate hazardous waste that is dangerous or illegal to dispose of in the trash and can also be harmful to the environment. Here is a list of the following items that are considered hazardous waste and should be disposed at a HHW location. These services are FREE for San Bernardino County **residents only**.

- Collection Facilities **Will Accept** Household Generated:
- Weed Killers, Cleaners, Gasoline, Antifreeze
- Wood Preservatives, Paints & Paint Products, Paint Thinner
- Auto & Furniture Polish, Chemical Drain Cleaners
- Pesticides & Fertilizers, Pool & Hobby Supplies
- Auto & Household Batteries
- Motor Oil, Oil Filters
- Electronic Waste Collection available throughout San Bernardino County. Call 1-800-Oily Cat for nearest location.
- Outdated Medications
- Sharps/Needles in approved container (not accepted at all locations)
- Mercury Thermostats



- Collection Facilities Will Not Accept:
- Business Wastes
- Wastes from Non-Profit Organizations
- Radioactives
- Explosives
- Medical Waste
- Asbestos
- Refrigerant cylinders
- Treated wood waste
- Auto injectors
- Reactive waste
- High watt-hour Li-Ion batteries
- Large compressed gas cylinders
- Remediation, construction, and demolition waste
- Large appliances (A/C, refrigerators, stoves, washers, dryers, etc.)

TIPS TO PREVENT FOOD WASTE AT HOME

- **Plan ahead:** Before you go to the grocery store or order out, check the fridge and pantry for food items that need to be cooked or that you already have and do not need to purchase.
- Serve smart: Aim to cook and serve the right portions for the number of people you are feeding.
- Store food wisely: Different foods require different conditions.
- Check your fridge often: Keep track of what you have and what needs to be used. Eat or freeze items before you need to throw them away.
- Use your freezer: Your freezer can help save food and time.

Your recycling efforts contribute to the reduction of greenhouse gas emissions from landfilled organic waste. This includes methane, a greenhouse gas 80 times more potent than carbon dioxide.
