Join us for our Fall 2026 compost and mulch giveaway. Grab a shovel, tarp, container, bags, and gloves and head over to Chaffey College to load up on these garden essentials. Open to Rancho Cucamonga residents only. Proof of residency is required. No trailers or commercial vehicles allowed.

Follow these steps:

1. Enter through Haven Avenue (Main Campus entrance)
2. Check-in (proof of residency)
3. Park and load up to one cubic yard of compost and/or mulch.
4. Cover and secure your load and then exit through Wilson Avenue.

Hot Ashes and Charcoal Disposal

One common cause for fires in trucks and containers is hot coals and ashes. Coals can appear to be cool and actually remain hot for days after use. Please allow 48 to 72 hours for charcoal and ashes to cool down before disposing of them in the trash container.

TIPS TO PREVENT FOOD WASTE AT HOME

- **Plan ahead:** Before you go to the grocery store or order out, check the fridge and pantry for food items that need to be cooked or that you already have and do not need to purchase.
- **Serve smart:** Aim to cook and serve the right portions for the number of people you are feeding.
- **Store food wisely:** Different foods require different conditions.
- **Check your fridge often:** Keep track of what you have and what needs to be used. Eat or freeze items before you need to throw them away.
- **Use your freezer:** Your freezer can help save food and time.

Your recycling efforts contribute to the reduction of greenhouse gas emissions from landfilled organic waste. This includes methane, a greenhouse gas 80 times more potent than carbon dioxide.
