Senate Bill 1383

Senate Bill 1383 is a California Senate Bill that focuses on reducing and properly recycling food waste to reduce harmful greenhouse gas emissions such as methane in our state. Reducing greenhouse gas emissions like methane can help improve air quality and lessen the impacts on health conditions such as asthma. All residents of Rancho Cucamonga are required to divert food waste from the landfill by collecting food scraps (i.e. fruits, vegetables, food-soiled paper, leftovers, etc.) in a bag and placing the secured food scraps bag into your green waste bin. Residential Christmas Tree Collection

Burrtec will collect and recycle your Christmas tree. Please place your tree at the curb from December 26, 2025, through January 13, 2026, on your regular collection day. Trees over 6 feet need to be cut in half. Please remove all ornaments, lights, and metal stands from the tree.





Extra Holiday Trash and Recycling

All gift boxes, wrapping paper, greeting cards, and cardboard boxes may be placed in your recycle barrel. Burrtec will collect your excess trash from December 26, 2025 through January 13, 2026. Place in a plastic bag alongside your containers on your collection day.

Holiday Schedule

Please note that services are interrupted on the following holidays:

- Memorial Day | Independence Day
- Labor Day | Thanksgiving Day
- Christmas Day | New Year's Day

When the holiday falls on a weekday, collections for the remainder of the week will be delayed by one day. There is no service interruption or delay when the holiday falls on a Saturday or Sunday.



GOT COOKING OIL?

RECYCLE IT!

Recycle your leftover liquid cooking oil to avoid the hassle of dealing with clogged pipes and other sewer problems.

Step 1 Cool oil to a safe temperature & filter to remove food particles.

Step 2 Pour oil into a jar or plastic container with a tight fitting lid.

Step 3 Take the oil to your nearest toxic waste collection center.
