- Food soiled paper, like napkins, fast food wrappers, coffee filters, and pizza boxes are also accepted and should be included with the bagged food waste.

*Please note that not all areas recycle Styrofoam.

Horse and Livestock Waste

Improperly stored manure can leach nutrients into ground and surface water. Collect soiled bedding and manure frequently from stalls and paddocks, and place in the green barrels for weekly removal. Residents disposing of horse and/or livestock waste may only use the automated green barrel provided for green waste and manure disposal. Horse and livestock



waste cannot be placed in any other container. Additional green barrels are available for a monthly fee. Please contact Burrtec's customer service department at (909) 987-3717.

Seasonal Green Waste Pick-Up

Excess seasonal green waste can be bundled and placed beside your green waste container for pick-up up to two times per year. Tie your prunings into bundles no larger than 18 inches in diameter and 4 feet long and they'll be hauled away at no additional cost. Remember your green waste container is for grass clippings, brush, prunings, leaves, twigs, weeds and branches smaller than 6 inches in diameter. Green waste is composted or recycled and is part of reducing the waste stream. If you consistently have more green waste than can be stored in your container, call Burrtec Waste Industries at (909) 987-3717.



Living with Wildlife Tips

You can help keep your neighborhood clean by doing the following:

- · Avoid placing trash and recycling out on windy days.
- Put trash cans out the morning of collection day.
- Store trash and recycling in the garage if possible.
- Do not leave pet food or water outside.
- Trim ground-level shrubbery to reduce hiding places.
- Pick-up fallen fruit from the ground.
- Be sure to place your trash into a large trash bag and tie it closed before placing in the barrel. This will make clean-up efforts easier should the barrels tip over.

Safe Sharps Disposal

The City of Rancho Cucamonga and the Rancho Cucamonga Fire Protection District have partnered to provide a safe method to dispose of homegenerated sharps from Rancho Cucamonga residents. To participate:

- 1. Go to any Rancho Cucamonga fire station Monday through Friday, 8 A.M. to 5 P.M., to pick up a free sharps approved container. Never leave sharps or full collection containers unattended if the crew is out of the station.
- 2. Fill your container to the marked fill limit line (usually three quarters of its capacity). Lock the lid to seal the container in order to prevent spills and accidental sticks.
- 3. Exchange your full container of used sharps for an empty one by returning it to any Rancho Cucamonga fire station, Monday through Friday, 8 A.M. to 5 P.M. Please contact Environmental Programs for more information (909) 919-2635.
