SENATE BILL 1383 ORGANICS DIVERSION AND RECYCLING ARE YOU IN COMPLIANCE?



HOW DOES THIS AFFECT MY BUSINESS OR PROPERTY?

Businesses are required to:

- Subscribe to recycling and/or organic waste collection service provided by Burrtec. (Customer must secure containers provided by Burrtec. If lost or stolen, customers are responsible for replacement cost.)
- Annually provide information to employees, contractors, tenants, and customers about recycling, organic waste collection requirements and proper sorting of materials.
- Ensure employees, contractors, tenants, and customers have access to an adequate number, size, and location of containers with appropriate labels and container color.
- Provide containers for the collection of all waste streams including trash, green waste, food waste and recyclables in all areas where disposal containers are provided for customers, except for restrooms.
- Provide information to new tenants before or within 14 days of occupancy.
- Prohibit employees from placing recycling and organic waste in a container not designated to receive those material types.

WHAT ARE THE ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS?

Supermarkets, grocery stores, food service providers, distributors, or wholesale food vendors have additional edible food recovery requirements such as:

- Not intentionally spoiling edible food that is capable of being recovered by a food recovery organization or service.
- Making arrangements via contract with a food recovery organization or service to recover edible food that can be redistributed for human consumption.

WHY IS ORGANIC WASTE A PROBLEM?

CalRecycle reports that organic waste in landfills accounts for 20 percent of the methane gas generated in California and reducing emissions helps in combating climate change.

Attention: Food Service Providers

Existing state law requires certain businesses to implement a recycling and organics program. However, the new law which went into effect July 1, 2020, requires food establishments that provide trash containers for products purchased and consumed on the premises to also provide properly labeled containers for recyclables and organic waste (food waste). These containers must be placed adjacent to trash containers.

AB 827 applies to limited-service restaurants such as those restaurants where customers order and pay at the counter and bus their own tables after eating. The law will affect restaurants, malls, and other businesses that serve food. Full-service food establishments that do not provide access to trash containers for products consumed on the premises will be exempt, as food workers will likely separate post-consumer food waste and recyclables in the dish washing areas.

Highlights:

- AB 827 requires collection containers at the front-of-house to be visible, accessible, and labeled.
- This law affects businesses that sell products that are meant for immediate consumption.
- Full-service restaurants where employees bus and clean tables are exempt but must provide labeled collection containers adjacent to trash containers for employees/staff to separate post-consumer recyclables and organics.



COMMERCIAL ORGANICS

The California State Legislature approved Assembly Bill 1826 (AB 1826) which mandates a statewide commercial organic waste recycling program. The bill includes requirements that businesses that generate at least two cubic yards of solid waste per week, must arrange for organic recycling services. Organic waste is foodwaste, green waste, landscape and pruning waste, nonhazardous wood waste and food-soiled paper waste mixed with food waste. California state requirements specify that applicable business generators must participate in at least one of the processes below:

 $\bullet \ Establish \ a \ food \ was te \ recycling \ program \ through \ the \ commercial \ was te \ hauler.$

• Recycle organic waste on-site, or self-haul organic waste off-site for recycling.

• Participate in a food recovery or food donation program to reduce landfill waste and help our neighbors, as one in eight Californians struggle with lack of access to food. Contact one of the local, non-profit organizations listed below to inquire about their ability to accept food donations from your business.

Whatever program you decide to incorporate at your business, the City of Santa Clarita will provide support and assistance to ensure your success in complying with State law and reducing landfill waste.

ONLY Rain DOWN THE STORM DRain

Santa Clarita's storm drain system empties into the Santa Clara River. When chemicals are spilled onto the pavement, or debris is left behind on our roadways, they will be washed down into the storm drain system, causing pollution of the river.

The Santa Clara River recharges the City's groundwater supply.

The storm drain system is made up of the following:

- Sidewalks
 - cvvants
- Streets
- Gutters
- Drainage Ditches
 - Catch Basins
 - Rooftops
- Driveways
- · Parking Lots
- Outfall Pipes

What kind of activities are prohibited?

- Disposal of pesticides, fungicides or herbicides into the storm drain system
- Disposal of hazardous and non-hazardous waste into the storm drain system (paint, antifreeze, motor oil, etc.)
 - · Disposal of leaves, dirt and other landscape debris into the storm drain system
 - Disposal of fuel, chemicals, animal waste, garbage and other materials that have potential negative impacts on water quality in the storm drain system

What's the bottom line?
If it's not rain, it doesn't go down the storm drain.

Ensure landscaping is not overwatered, which causes runoff into the gutter, and carries contaminants into the storm drains!
