How to Collect Food Waste at Home

- 1. Collect- Begin collecting food waste separate from your other trash and recycling. This includes: fruits, vegetables, meats, seafood, bread, dairy, eggshells, coffee, plate scrapings, peels, rinds, food soiled paper, and expired food.
- 2. Add & Secure- Add food waste to its own separate plastic-lined container. Store it in a convenient place, such as on your countertop, in your refrigerator or under your sink. Secure your plastic bag by tying it off. Remember, bags do not have to be compostable or biodegradable. They can be any color. We encourage you to re-use bags you may already have such as bread bags and produce bags.
- 3. Discard- Place your bagged food waste into your green barrel, along with your green waste. Continue using your green waste barrel as usual. Remember, food waste no longer belongs in your trash barrel.

1370 N. Benson Ave. Upland, CA 91786 Open every Saturday from 7:30 a.m. – 12:30 p.m. (except holidays & during inclement weather)

Accepted items: auto and household batteries, antifreeze, used motor oil, oil filters, cooking oil, electronic waste, fire extinguishers, fluorescent tubes, gasoline, household cleaners, mercury thermostats, needles/sharps in approved container, outdated medications, paints, paint products, and pool chemicals.

Transportation limit of 15 gallons or 125 lbs. per trip. Business waste is not accepted.

Free sharps containers and used oil containers are available for pick up when the HHW facility is open and at Public Works, 1370 N. Benson Ave., Monday-Thursday from 8:00 a.m. – 6:00 p.m.

LEARN WATER-SAVING TIPS DURING FIX A LEAK WEEK, MARCH 18-24, 2024

Did you know that household leaks can waste nearly one trillion gallons of water annually nationwide? The average household leak can account for over 11,000 gallons of water wasted ever year. That's more than enough water to fill a backyard swimming pool! The City of Upland has partnered with the Environmental Protection Agency and other water purveyors to promote water conservation through leak detection and repair. As part of national Fix a Leak Week, Upland will help educate residents about water-saving device rebates and programs, and share tips to help save water around your home. Tune in for tips and tricks on Upland's City social media platforms during Fix a Leak Week. Common types of leaks found at home include worn toilet flappers, dripping faucets, and leaking showerheads. All are easily correctable! To help you find and correct some common household leaks, pick up a free Fix-A-Leak Kit at the Upland Public Works Department, 1370 N. Benson Ave., Upland during office hours, Monday-Thursday, 8:00 a.m.-6:00 p.m., while supplies last. Recipients must show proof of being an Upland water customer.
