Top 5 Items to Keep OUT of the Recycling Bin

Here are the top 5 items that should never be placed in the recycling bin:

- **1.** No garden hoses. Despite being made from rubber, vinyl, or a combination of both, this item still belongs in the trash.
- 2. No diapers. Diapers should be placed in your trash bin.
- **3.** No hazardous waste. This means no paint, motor oil, batteries, syringes, needles, etc. Hazardous Waste places our facility staff at risk. Do not place into any of your Burrtec collection containers.
- 4. No pet food bags. The wax coating prevents the bags from breaking down in the recycling process, so pet food bags go into the trash bin.
- **5.** No electronic waste. These items are best recycled through a proper e-recycler.

Remember to keep the blue barrel free of contamination!

Scavenging is Illegal

Removal of garbage and/or recyclables from solid waste containers is punishable by law (Title 8 Chapter 8.28 Section 8.28.390 & 8.28.400)

Collection Day Reminder

On collection day, please place your containers in the street, at the curb, or near the corner of your driveway. The containers handles should be facing your home. Barrels should be placed 1 foot apart from each other. The containers need to be placed at least 3 feet away from any obstruction such as a fence, mailbox, or vehicle.



Bulky Item Pick-Up

Are you replacing an old sofa, water heater or refrigerator and don't know what to do with it? We'll take care of it. Residents can request up to four curbside collections of large or bulky items during a 12 month period (pickup second week of Feb/May/Aug/Nov). Limit of five items per collection. This program also includes electronic waste. This program is at no additional cost and designed for your convenience. Please call our Customer Service Department one week prior to your scheduled collection day to arrange pick-up.

All barrels must be curbside by 6:00 a.m. on your service day.
