

COMMERCIAL TRASH SERVICE

Burrtec provides waste collection services, to all of the commercial and industrial establishments in Fontana. If you would like to review your business's waste and recycling programs, please contact our office at (909) 822-9739 to receive a free waste assessment.

Bin Services

Sizes ranging from 1.5 cubic yards to 6 cubic yards Compactor bins in 3 to 4 cubic yards.

Roll-Off Services

10 Cubic yard demolition or roofing boxes 20, 30, and 40 cubic yard debris boxes 40 cubic yard compactors.

Special Services

- Locking bins (trash or recycling)
- Extra pick-ups

Large or Bulky Items

Burrtec will collect unwanted bulky items at your business or multifamily complex at no additional charge. Please place items in the designated area or next to the bin or bin enclosure. Large or bulky items include: illegal dumping, scrap metal, wood, old appliances, furniture, televisions, computer monitors, refrigerators, tied & bundled tree branches, mattresses, etc. Multifamily complexes will be serviced once a week, no call is necessary. Commercial customers can call in and request a bulky item pickup. Please place items out the night before or no later than 6:00 a.m. on the day of collection.



Holiday Schedule

Burrtec observes the following holidays: New Year's Day, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day and Christmas Day. When a holiday falls on a weekday, service will be delayed by one day. There is no service interruption or delay when the holiday falls on a Sunday.

MIXED RECYCLING

One outstanding feature of Burrtec's commitment to the City of Fontana is recycling collection at no additional charge. Our recycling team is eager to help implement successful recycling programs that are customized to suit the needs of your business. A specialist will visit your business to gain an understanding of operations and to identify any items for recycling. After the site visit, a program is designed to help reduce costs and increase recycling.

California Assembly Bill 341 (AB 341) includes a mandatory commercial recycling component in the effort to save landfill space. All businesses with four or more yards of collection service (per week) will be required to establish and maintain recycling service. Compliance is easy! Commercial trash barrel and bin service includes a recycling container of same size and frequency of service at no additional cost.

DO NOT mix trash or hazardous waste with recyclable materials. Contaminated materials can often prevent recyclables from being reclaimed. Please recycle responsibly.

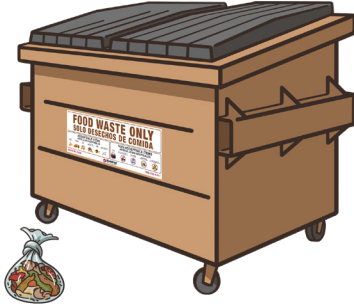

RECYCLING COLLECTION PROGRAMS



MANDATORY ORGANICS LEGISLATION

The state agency CalRecycle reports that organic waste in landfills accounts for 20 percent of the methane gas generated in California, which contributes to public health and safety concerns such as asthma. Methane emission reduction helps in combating climate change. To address this, California passed a law, Senate Bill 1383, with a goal to improve air quality by reducing negative emissions from food waste and landscape waste being delivered to landfills. This law requires businesses and multi-family complexes to recycle their food waste and landscape waste.



It also requires edible food generating businesses such as grocery stores, food service distributors, supermarkets and restaurants to provide the edible food (that would otherwise be disposed of) to organizations that will redistribute it. The State requires that all business owners/generators:

- Separate organic waste from other waste and participate in a waste recycling service that includes collection and recycling of organic waste or recycling of organic waste on site*.
- Provide information to new tenants before or within 14 days of occupation of the premises about waste recovery requirements and proper sorting of organic waste.
- Annually provide information about waste recovery requirements and proper sorting of organic waste to employees, contractors, tenants, and customers.
- Businesses identified as a Tier 1 or Tier 2 edible food generator must establish an agreement with and donate edible food waste to an eligible food rescue organization.

EDIBLE FOOD GENERATOR TIPS TO PREVENT FOOD WASTE

Here are some ways businesses can reduce food waste:

- **Plan and track:** Plan meals based on demand and track waste to identify areas for improvement. Menu design: Create menu specials that use ingredients that are close to their expiration date. Remove items that don't sell well.
- **Staff training:** Train staff on how to minimize food waste, including proper temperature management and stock rotation.
- **Store food properly:** Store food in the refrigerator and use airtight containers for grains.
- **Monitor production:** Weigh food at each stage of production to identify and correct production loss.

Landscape Waste

Landscape waste/green waste should be placed loosely in the organics barrel or bin.

Acceptable Landscape Waste:

- Brush & shrub trimmings
- Small branches
- Grass clippings
- Twigs
- Leaves
- Weeds



Non-acceptable Landscape Waste:

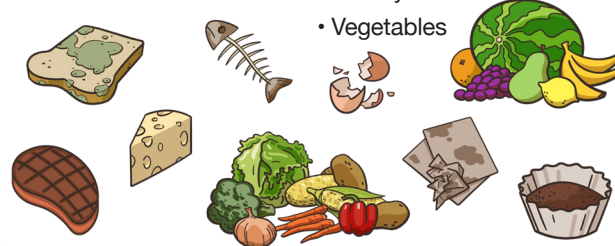
- Birds of paradise
- Dirt & rock
- Cactus
- Palm fronds
- Concrete
- Plastic bags

Food Waste

A variety of food waste collection service levels are available to commercial and industrial customers in the City of Fontana.

Acceptable Food Waste:

- Breads & grains
- Eggshells
- Coffee grounds & filters
- Food soiled paper products
- Cooked meat
- Fruits
- Cooked seafood
- Poultry
- Cheese
- Vegetables



Non-acceptable Materials:

- Glass products
- Non-biodegradable materials
- Metal products
- Plastic products



ORGANICS RECYCLING

Recycling of organics, such as landscape waste and food waste, is mandatory for businesses in accordance with California Senate Bill 1383 (SB 1383). Landscape waste and food waste must be handled and stored separately from trash and other recyclables to avoid contamination. All businesses are required to separate food waste and green waste from trash and other recyclables. All multi-family complexes are required to recycle food waste and green waste in the organics barrel.

EDIBLE FOOD RECOVERY

Businesses that have excess edible food, must recover and donate that edible food to reduce unnecessary food waste and feed people. Commercial edible food generators are required to:

1. Arrange to recover the maximum amount of excess edible food that would otherwise go to landfills.
2. Establish a written agreement with a food recovery organization or service that will accept edible food from your business.
3. Maintain records of all edible food recovery activities and receipts.
4. Provide copies of written agreement(s) with food recovery organization(s) each year.
